
Focus on indigenous tribes (Unreached people)

EMCI Mission Center Rules & Guidelines

1. No Food in the Dorm

- To maintain cleanliness and prevent pests, food is not allowed inside the dormitory.

7. Waste Disposal


- Dispose of trash properly in designated bins.

Dress Code:

- Refrain from running, playing aggressively, or giving piggyback rides on the fields.

- Wear sun-protective clothing, including long-sleeved shirts, pants, hats, sunglasses, and sunscreen.

Appropriate Touch:


- Verbal praise
- Side hugs and shoulder to shoulder hugs
- Pats on the shoulder, back, or head
- Touching hands, shoulders, and arms

Do NOT:

- · Touching buttocks, chests, genital areas, or thighs
- Full body hugs, Kissing, Tickling
- Any behavior that could be interpreted as sexual in nature

Essentials Items on the Mission Trip

- Ensure you have a current and unexpired US passport or Green Card.
- Carry both your passport/green card and FMM visa at all times.
- Bring any necessary medications you take regularly.
- Pack a light sleeping bag
- Toiletries and a towel (shampoo and boy wash are provided)
- Bring a refillable water bottle; drinking water will be available for refills.
- Use soft and lightweight bags, such as old backpacks, for easy transport.

- Slipper


